About Three2Six

The Three2Six program is run by a Marist school, Sacred Heart College, in Johannesburg, South Africa. It provides an education bridging program for children who have been denied access to local public schools. Most of the children are from Central Africa and live in very difficult conditions, their families struggling for survival. Three2Six provides educational support, a nutritious meal each day and most important of all, hope for a brighter future. 200 students and 6 teachers who are themselves refugees use the school's facilities each day from 3pm to 6pm and Three2Six works with the children and their families to build skills and education foundations and then to help transition the students into local schools.

How you can help

We are running a two week holiday program and are looking for Aussie volunteers to come and help run games, sports, music, arts and craft, computer sessions and to help with reading practice and literacy and numeracy revision. We are also looking for Aussie teachers to come and mentor our Three2Six teachers.

Come to South Africa

Participants are expected to cover their own costs, including flights, travel insurance and to contribute to a small group kitty for meals and groceries. We'll help find safe local accommodation and also organise a reduced price weekend safari with the group over the week-end in the middle of the program.

The holiday program will run for 5 hours each day. There will also be lots of time for participants to experience other local projects, sights and experiences. An Australian leader will support the program but participants will be independent travellers who take responsibility for their own travel decisions and safety.
