Dear Brothers, Friends and Colleagues

Time was running out, I was assured last week by an unsolicited email from hotels.com, for my “Valentine’s Day Escape”.

A curious expression.

An implication is that love is something that happens in exotic places and in out-of-the-ordinary ways, and requires roses. You need to escape from your day-to-day life to find it and to fire it. I guess that’s as good a sales pitch as any if you are in the business of flogging hotel rooms in such places.

Our business, as Marists, is love, but our places for loving tend not to be exotic or out of the box. They are classrooms, and school yards, and dormitories, and counselling rooms, and playing fields, and tuckshop queues. They are today. They are here. Love is our starting point as educators of young people, St Marcellin tells us, as it is also our means, and our goal. And to unpack what that meant, two of Marcellin’s favourite pieces of advice to his early Brothers came from directing them to 1 Corinthians 13 and 1 John 4:7-8. It would be well for us, as Marist educators, to spend some time in prayerful reading of these Scriptures as we take up our responsibilities for the new academic year. Our Founder would be pleased with that; we would be putting our hearts in the space that he believed was the only place for someone who presumed to be an educator, in whose hands the life of a young person was to be entrusted. It was the surest way to lead to God.

The Province theme for our ministries this year – #SERVEoneanother – is sourced in this kind of heart-space. It leads us into a love that is grounded, faithful, humble, resilient, forgiving, believing, other-centred, and truthful.

Truthful. Marcellin called it simplicity, and some Marist scholars have seen this trait as Marcellin’s most defining. It carries a sense of transparency of purpose, lack of pretence, no games of power, an absence of masks; it presumes a starting point of trust and belief. It makes for joy. It sows seeds of hope.

In writing to one of the first Brothers, Marcellin ended his letter with the powerful exclamation: “How much good you can do!” Indeed, how much good will bring 2014 bring for the young people in our care!

NEW ST MARCELLIN ICON UNVEILED

Last Friday afternoon saw a special Marist gathering at the Catholic Education Office in Sydney. The occasion was the blessing of the main board room at the CEO which has been named the "Marcellin Room". A feature of the room is a stunning icon of St Marcellin by Sydney iconographer Michael



Galovic. This icon was commissioned jointly by the ten Marist schools in the Archdiocese and unveiled on Friday. It was blessed in a special service by Bishop Peter Comensoli who is Chair of the Sydney Archdiocesan Catholic Schools Board.

VICTORIAN BUSHFIRES

The recent bush fires in Victoria, the worst in five years since Black Friday, have impacted upon the communities of both Assumption College, Kilmore and Lavalla Catholic College, Traralgon.

A fierce grass fire swept through Kilmore on Sunday causing the evacuation of the boarding house. Seventy-five boarders and staff were bussed to Seymour and spent the night at the clubrooms of the Seymour sports ground. On Monday, it was decided to close the school and the boarders were sent home. The situation is still serious and the school remains closed. Whilst the College has not been impacted upon by the fire, it is within a few kilometres of the property. With the majority of staff and students coming from surrounding areas and with many roads closed, the school will remain closed until it is deemed safe for it to be reopened.

Lavalla Catholic College in the Latrobe Valley has also been affected by bushfires in the area with many roads closed and access for both staff and students limited. As a result classes were suspended on Monday, however the College remains open for those who are able to access the school. As members of the Australian Marist Community, we assure both Michael Kenny, Principal of Assumption and John Freeman, in his first weeks as Principal of Lavalla and their respective communities our prayers and best wishes at this very difficult time.
