Dear Brothers, Colleagues and Friends

There are some things that I just don't get, such as why a man would choose to wear a business suit that is royal blue in colour, or why a young woman with beautiful skin would want to ink it indelibly with a giant tattoo, or why God made mosquitoes. But, of this I am sure: the education of young people is one of the noblest pursuits to which a person could devote his or her life.

Marcellin certainly thought so. At a time when the quality of the schooling for children from the rural hamlets and small towns of France – which was where the great majority of them lived at the time – was often a matter of chance, the founder of Marist education believed things should and could be different. And so he acted. It was simply not right, he was convinced, that an accident of birth or privilege should determine whether or not a young person had the opportunity to be well educated. The empowerment and liberation that are the fruit of knowledge, understanding and competency should not be the preserve of a lucky minority. Deeply planted ever since, in our collective psyche as Marists, has been the desire for all young people to enjoy what should be theirs by right. We look for ways to make that happen, and we will be doing so again in 2016. Theologians might describe our efforts as helping to bring about the reign of God – the way that the order of things should be – but I suspect most of us simply do it because we intuit it to be right and just.

Speaking late last year to the first-ever international congress of Catholic education organised by the Vatican, Pope Francis emphasised this point in particular. He urged the thousands of educational leaders who had gathered in Rome from every corner of the Earth to ensure that their schools and projects did not operate as gated communities. "The greatest failure that an educator can have," the Holy Father said, "is to educate within the walls – the walls of selectivity, the walls of a culture of security, the walls of social affluence." He implored them to seek out those young people who were in most serious need of education.

As we take up our work for another year, we do so in a world where so many people of influence are trying quite hard to build impenetrable walls of exclusion, self-protection, and self-righteousness. They like to pretend that they are the only deserving ones on the planet. Political campaigns are being fought; ideological wars are being waged. Drivel parades as moral rhetoric. It has the emotional and intellectual equivalence of a screaming child locking his or her bedroom door and shutting out the rest of the family. As history shows, however, "splendid isolationism" always ends up as an oxymoron – whether it be in a country, a club, a church, a social group, a classroom, or even an individual person.

What drives people to circle their wagons in this way? Fear, usually. And what is it that fuels fear? So often it is ignorance. Dull-witted, cocooned, blinkered ignorance. Few things are more insidious that ignorance; and few more liberating than education.

It's already Week 3 in many places, and no doubt the busyness and demands of school life are well back in play. Perhaps the lofty hopes and visioning of staff days are already dimming. Hold on to them, for it is indeed a noble endeavour that we are about. There is much to address in our world, and our contribution is to be its educators. Marcellin would want us to be great ones.
