#### From Brother Michael Green

Dear Brothers, Colleagues and Friends

Rugby was taken seriously at Maitland. As Easter approached, talk in the junior staff study turned to the most likely chances for the local club team with whom some of the younger teachers were associated – either as players or advisors. I was well positioned in the latter group. Planning intensified; momentum built. As a first-year teacher, and in a new town, it was not surprising that I would find myself seeking some involvement. The team didn't actually have any club rooms as such, and I am unsure if there was a training field, since all the strategizing, player selections, and team preparation took place at the *Currency Lass* on Friday evenings, with physical exercise limited to blowing the froth off one or two or more schooners of 'Hunter black'. Everyone was very committed. At least that's my memory of how it happened.

When in Maitland recently, I noticed that the *Currency Lass* was still gracing High Street, although it looked in sad need of coat of paint, and patronage seemed a little light. I don't know if training methods have been modified, but there would be no need to do so, as they proved to be quite successful. And it was a lot of fun.

How much fun the thirty-two teams will have in Brazil for the FIFA World Cup from next week is yet to be seen. Probably not as much as those who will be in the stands and the thousands of millions who will tune in from around the world. I suspect none of the national teams will be seeking any advice or inspiration from Maitland DRU. Even the Socceroos – who may be in need of all the assistance they can get – are likely to put their trust elsewhere. But expert opinions, penetrating match analysis, ideas for attack and defensive strategy, and beer, will all be in abundant supply in pubs and living rooms across the globe. Passions will be high. People will keep odd hours and wear unusual outfits. And it will be a lot of fun.

Negative criticism of the World Cup will also not be scarce. And with reason. The amount of money required for new stadiums and player facilities, and the zillions that will be lavished on travel and accommodation by fans is, many would say, indulgent and scandalous. People have died. The opportunity cost for social programmes and health and education that won't happen is enormous. The taint of corruption won't go away. While Eastern Europe teeters, people continue to starve in Syria, and instability disrupts people's lives from Libya to Thailand, we are all going to be focussed on the efforts and antics of a bunch of over-paid footballers.

There's no escaping confronting reality of those moral conundrums. So much of life is caught in such binds. How should a person of conscience respond? There may be no readymade ethical answer to that question, but being blithely blasé about injustice nor being paralysingly crushed by the weight of it are healthy ways to preserve our own humanity as we deal with it. Each of us needs to plot a path that is both responsible and life-giving. Interesting potential discussions to have with our students as we help to form them into good Christians and good citizens.
