Dear Brothers, Colleagues and Friends

Something momentous will occur at Mittagong at the end of this week, something that has not happened before. The significance may have slipped our notice – given that it's called a "Mission Assembly". We've held those events before, haven't we? You know the drill: a talkfest among a group of true believers; a couple of days off school. Great experience for those who are there. Inspiring liturgy, delightful meals. Maybe the publishing of some communiqué gushing with the ephemeral enthusiasm of the participants. Then everything duly filed.

Can I propose, as non-clichéd as I can, that "this one is going to be different"?

When sixty-four Australian Marists gather over four days from this Thursday, they will do so as Members of the Marist Association of St Marcellin Champagnat. All of them. They have been chosen as delegates either by nomination of their fellow-Members (two-thirds) or because of their current roles (one third). They come charged with responsibility. Regional gatherings have been held, local groups have met. The Association – which we anticipate will be approved by the Holy See in the months ahead – is the new space for all Marists to come together to share responsibility for the vitality and development of Marist life and ministry. Already 540 have joined and others are in the process of doing so. They are women and men, consecrated, married, single, ordained, younger and older. For all them, the Marist approach to the gospel of Jesus is a significant dimension of the way they live out their Baptismal call. They are a new ecclesial family, and this will be their first ever formal representative gathering.

They will also do so with the knowledge that, during the next three years, all canonical and civil responsibility for Marist schools and other ministries will pass from the Brothers alone to this expanded group of Marists which is the Marist Association of St Marcellin. Just let me run that by you again, for emphasis: it will be the Association, not the Province, which will have charge of Marist ministries, and will take responsibility for its own spiritual and communal Marist life. The Brothers will continue to be a intregral subset of that Association, more focussed on their particular contribution as religious, but they will not be its numerical majority. The "Association Council" which will be nominated by the Assembly to replace the current Mission Council, will be chosen from among the Members of the Association, and will become the leadership group for it, as well as its trustees in civil law. This is how the buzz-words "communion" and "co-responsibility" are going to look in practice. The future will be different, and the future is upon us.

Without presuming to re-write or re-imagine the purpose and vision of our Marist origins, because they are creatures of a church and world of another time, it is not too much of a stretch to believe that Marcellin and his co-founders would be greatly pleased with all of this. They longed for a wide embrace of their spiritual intuitions across the church, and they proposed ways for lay people, priests and religious to live them out, each appropriate to their state of life. They also planned for them all to be in union with one another. Something "new for our time" they said. It's taken two hundred years, but perhaps we've finally nailed it.

Let us pray for that this week's Assembly be a moment of grace and blessing for us all.

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2016 UPDATE



World Youth Day 2016 is approaching closer with the countdown now less than one year away! It is expected that somewhere between 4-5 million Catholic youth from around the world will gather with Pope Francis in Kraków for the celebrations. EXCITING PLANS FOR NEW CLASSROOMS AT ABAFALA SCHOOL IN TIMOR-LESTE



Marist Solidarity will soon begin work to reconstruct dilapidated classroom buildings at the Abafala Catholic Primary School in Timor-Leste.

The project is now possible thanks to the generous support received from international funding partners, and the fundraising efforts of Marist Schools Australia, especially Galen Catholic College, Wangaratta, Notre Dame College Shepparton, and Catholic College Sale.

In 2012, members of the Abafala community reached out to Marist Solidarity to highlight the urgent need to improve conditions at its primary school, which local building professionals declared derelict and unsafe.

Several of the classrooms are termite-infested with collapsing ceiling and wall structures, leaking roofs, and floors made of broken and cracked concrete.

The local community are mainly subsistence farmers that do not have resources to undertake the necessary work.

The Abafala School is located within the Baucau district, and is the only primary school in this poor, rural area. It provides education for 105 boys and 128 girls.

Marist Solidarity is working in partnership with the local community, and the Catholic education office of the Diocese of Baucau to develop plans to rebuild three classrooms and five toilet cubicles.
