Journey of the Marist Bicentennial Paintings

To mark our Bicentenary, four pieces of art have been commissioned to make a national journey of Marist Australia between February and September this year. This journey of the four paintings was launched at Santa Teresa in Central Australia last week and will now continue this journey in two pairs – one starting in Cairns in the far north, and one in Perth in the west.

Please see below a reflection on the ceremony held in Alice Springs to begin the journey of the Bicentennial paintings.

The paintings will be passed from one Marist community to another, spending four or five days in each, with all four finally arriving in Mittagong. Throughout the eight month journey, school communities will receive the paintings and gather around them, with prayer and educational resources available to help them to do this. The Elders, the young students of Santa Teresa School, their teachers, friends and invited guests gathered in front of the Santa Teresa Church, on Thursday 16 February, for the official launch and blessing of the Bicentennial Paintings by Bishop Eugene Hurley.

It was the clearest of skies while the central Australian sun warmed our backs; the slight breeze sent the smoke from our ceremony swirling among us and Bishop Eugene spoke words that told us of the strong Marist tradition in the Ltyentye Apurte community. We all listened attentively. Even the dogs resting and at play at the feet of the youngsters seemed to sense the mood of importance and celebration. A significant number of Brothers in attendance, all wearing their white soutanes, stood prominently against the rusty ochre of our landscape as the paintings were brought ceremoniously through the smoke into the Church for their blessing.

On Friday 17 February we celebrated the Opening Mass at Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Catholic College in Alice Springs where we, again, heard the story of each of the four paintings, each different yet each contributing to the story of the mission of Marists in the way of St Marcellin Champagnat: to make Jesus known and loved. All the while the God of the Holy Dreaming was with us as we gathered to celebrate 200 years of Marist mission in the Church throughout the world.

Our Central Australian community then said goodbye to the paintings as they embarked on their own pilgrimage visiting Marist schools and communities around Australia as a reminder of our enduring tradition and a symbol of our 200th birthday celebrations.





Finally, last week Frank Malloy, National Director of MSA was involved in an accident while cycling. Frank has sustained a number of fractures and concussion and remains in hospital. We wish Frank a speedy return to full health and assure him of our prayers. During his absence Paul Herrick will be Acting National Director.

As the new year begins, three of the team at Australian Marist Solidarity (AMS) in Brisbane have been in the field to visit some of our supported development projects throughout Asia. AMS works with the people in this region on a combination of long-term and short-term development projects. These projects aim to support, locally sustained education opportunities for the young people in these regions.

These visits came at a very important time as many of the projects were at crucial junctions in their development. To that extent, we are heartened with what lays ahead for AMS and the wider Marist community. From another school refurbishment in Ossu Timor-Leste, to the continued development of The Village project in Takhmau Cambodia and the completed Marist Brothers house in Pailin Cambodia, there is certainly a strong movement of change developing throughout the region.

The AMS team were able to blog about our experiences as we visited Mae Sot Thailand, Kawthaung Myanmar, Ranong Thailand, Samut Sakhon Thailand, Sa Pa Vietnam, Hanoi & Quoc Oai Vietnam, Pailin Cambodia, La Valla School Cambodia and Baucau Timor-Leste.
