Dear Colleagues

In this past week the world has been horrified by the events in Manchester. The attack on innocent people, mainly young girls enjoying a spring-time concert, and the devastation inflicted on families is acutely felt by parents and educators the world over.

In such circumstances, being a follower of Jesus is tough. The injustice of the attack bores into our very core and rages against the values we have been taught and have had modelled to us since we were children. Yet as leaders in Catholic education we must seek to ignite in our communities responses that are filled with compassion, forgiveness, and hope. Rather than bland platitudes, the young people in our care need help to think through such a tragic event. Questions, which seek the causes of the spread of violent fanaticism, must be asked. Facts depicting the reality of the terror and loss in Britain, Europe, Iraq, Syria and Afghanistan over the past 15 years need be understood. The scores of lives lost paint a catastrophic picture of human failure.

Martin Luther King famously used the adage "Violence begets violence". He also wrote:

"The ultimate weakness of violence is that it is a descending spiral begetting the very thing it seeks to destroy, instead of diminishing evil, it multiplies it. Through violence you may murder the liar, but you cannot murder the lie, nor establish the truth. Through violence you may murder the hater, but you do not murder hate. In fact, violence merely increases hate.

Returning violence for violence multiplies violence, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

Do not the words of the beatitudes, spoken almost 2000 years ago, echo resoundingly as we consider the terror. May the words of Jesus himself guide us and our school communities during this time and drown the voices of hate and absolutism.

How blessed are the poor in spirit: The kingdom of heaven is theirs. Blessed are the gentle: They shall have the earth as inheritance. Blessed are those who mourn: They shall be comforted. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for uprightness: They shall have their fill. Blessed are the merciful: They shall have mercy shown them. Blessed are the pure in heart: They shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers: They shall be recognised as children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted in the cause of uprightness: The kingdom of heaven is theirs.


