

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


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I enjoyed and appreciated the opportunity to reflect on the importance of our jobs - it is energising to remember the impact we can have.

Despite COVID lockdowns, restrictions, and major building material shortages – the reconstruction of cyclone-damaged St Michel's Technical College is almost complete!

In April 2020, Tropical Cyclone Harold made landfall on the island of Espiritu Santo as an intense Category 5 system with sustained winds of over 200km/h. Harold cut across the southern end of Santo, home to Vanuatu's second largest town, Luganville, and continued eastwards impacting a further six islands and about one-third of the country's population. An estimated 90% of structures were damaged, agricultural land ruined, roads blocked and water systems destroyed. TC Harold came at a time when Vanuatu had closed its borders to keep the threat of COVID-19 from its shores. St Michel is located on the western outskirts of Luganville and bore the brunt of Harold and suffered crippling damage.

Some of the school buildings were completely destroyed or damaged beyond repair, with very few escaping any damage. The main damage at the school was roof destruction, and subsequent water damage in the buildings that destroyed books, resources, equipment and furniture.

There are 434 students enrolled at St Michel, comprising 213 boys and 221 girls. This is made up of 354 students in the academic stream (grades 7 to 12) and 80 students in the technical stream learning trades such as mechanics, woodwork, hospitality, cooking, welding and sewing. There are 27 staff members.

Thanks to generous AMS donors and funding contributions, a reconstruction plan was put into place quickly. The school identified five priority areas for repair, to be undertaken in two

phases. The first phase, comprising rebuilding the technical workshop and classroom, and the boys' toilet block, is now complete.

Project coordinator and St Michel's English teacher, Brother Raphael Fakaia advises that Phase 2, which includes repairing the year 9 classroom building and staffroom, and replacing 15 computers that were destroyed, is now also close to full completion.

Br Ralph provided the following update:

"The classrooms are on track to be completed by the end of August. At the moment we are also in the process of purchasing the computers. We are still waiting for the quote and once we receive it, we will buy the computers. Thank you so much and may you have a great week ahead. God bless."
