

Breathe: Champagnat College Pagewood




COV9D Footsteps

Some insights from the group:

The program made me more aware that it is up to all of us to live the Marist values and keep the spirit of St Marcellin alive in the work we do each day and share it with everyone we meet.

It inspired me to find the courage to respond to my vocational call. It helped me realize that I am making a difference, and that I need to continue to be present, and give my time to both staff and students.



While Jesus is the human face of God in our midst, the Holy Spirit isn't usually described in human terms but rather in images such as breath, wind, water, fire, and oil. These images from nature remind us of "the otherness" of the Spirit. They resist our tendencies to domesticate the Spirit who is experienced in the depths of human relationships and in the wilderness and beauty of the natural world. 




MYM NSW/ACT
